
Katya Balen: The Light in Everything (2023 Carnegie Shortlist)

Holly Black: The Stolen Heir (Book 1 The Stolen Heir)




Sita Brahmachari: When Shadows Fall (2023 Carnegie Shortlist)

Jessie Burton: Medusa – The Girl behind the myth <mark>(2023</mark> Carnegie Shortlist)




Soman Chainani: Rise of the School for Good and Evil (Book 7 School for Good and Evil)




Cassandra Clare: Chain of Thorns (The Last Hours Book 3)


Cassandra Clare: The Red Scrolls Magic (Book 2 The Eldest Curses) (Shadowhunters novel)


Cassandra Clare: The Red Scrolls Magic (Book 1 The Eldest Curses) (Shadowhunters novel)

Catherine Doyle & Katherine Webber: Twin Crowns






Kiran Millwood Hargrave: Leila and the Blue Fox

Lauren James: Green Rising <mark>(2023 (arnegie Longlist)</mark>






Lauren James: The Reckless Afterlife of Harriet Stoker




Maureen Johnson: The Box in the Woods


Tricia Levenseller: Blade of Secrets (Book 1 of The Bladesmith Duology)


Tahereh Mafi: This Woven Kingdom



Krystal Marquis: The Davenports




Anna Perera: The Glass Collector (Lit in Colour)


Lynn Painter: Better than the Movies


Amara Sage: Influential

Manon Stefan Ros: The Blue Book of Nebo (2023 Carnegie Shortlist)




Marcus Sedgwick: Wrath (2023 Carnegie Longlist)


Ruta Sepetys: I must betray you (2023 Carnegie Shortlist)

Angharad Walker: Once upon a fever



Mary Watson: Blood to Poison




Laura Wood: The Agency for Scandal
