




Alasdair Beckett-King: Murder at the Museum (BBA Longlist 2024)


In his mind, Ferran Burke is many things

Judith Eagle: The Accidental Stowaway


Liverpool, 1910.

Isaac Fitzsimons: The Passing Playbook (Lit in Colour Reading list)

Fifteen-year-old Spencer Harris is a proud nerd, an awesome big brother and a Messi-in-training. He's also transgender. After transitioning at his old school leads to a year of bullying, Spencer gets a fresh start at Oakley, the most liberal private school in Ohio.At Oakley, Spencer seems to have it all: more accepting classmates, a decent shot at a starting position on the boy's soccer team, great new friends, and maybe even something more than friendship with one of his teammates. The problem is, no one at Oakley knows Spencer is trans - he's passing. So when a discriminatory law forces Spencer's coach to bench him after he discovers the 'F' on Spencer's birth certificate, Spencer has to make a choice: cheer his team on from the sidelines or publicly fight for his right to play, even if it means coming out to everyone - including the guy he's falling for.



Ele Fountain: Wild <mark>(BBA Longlist 2024)</mark>

Jack Ever since Jack's dad died, he's had a heavy feeling inside. The pressure keeps building. Looking for release, he starts skiving school and hanging around with a group who like to cause trouble. It's easy to hide his new habits from his mum, an environmental anthropologist, because she's too busy with work and conservation trips to notice. As Jack spins further out of control, his mum eventually becomes concerned - and shocks him by suggesting a trip together. But this will be no relaxing holiday. Soon Jack finds himself on an expedition deep into the rainforest, far from anything he's ever known. He wanted an adventure - but has he plunged into real danger?




Simon Fox: Running out of Time (BBA Longlist 2024)

I can steal time. The most I can take at the moment is fifteen seconds, which is not a lot. Grandmother took almost three minutes once and she told me she's done more, but I never saw it. When Alex and his father are forced to flee their home to escape a brutal government, they begin a life-threatening journey across Europe. But when they are separated before they can reach Britain, Alex finds himself alone, with only his extraordinary gift to keep him alive.



Camryn Garrett: Off the Record (Lit in Colour Reading list)

When seventeen-year-old Josie Wright wins a contest to write a celebrity profile for *Deep Focus* magazine, she's equal parts excited and scared. Soon she is jetting off on a multi-city tour, rubbing elbows with sparkly celebrities, frenetic handlers, stone-faced producers, and eccentric stylists. She even finds herself catching feelings for the subject of her profile, dazzling young newcomer Marius Canet. Josie's world is expanding so rapidly, she doesn't know whether she's flying or falling. But when a young actress lets her in on a terrible secret, and then the secrets keep coming, she realizes she's in over her head. She wants to do the right thing, but is this her story to tell? What if she lets down the women who have entrusted her with their stories? What if this ends her writing career before it even begins? There are so many reasons not to go ahead . . . but if Josie doesn't step up, who will?




Connie Glynn: Princess ever after (Book 5 The Rosewood Chronicles)

Jamie is Ellie's Partizan, a lifelong bodyguard sworn to protect the princess at any cost - but has mysteriously disappeared.


Not all of the trio have made it back to Rosewood Hall. Can they be reunited? And at what cost? With the crown at risk, the stakes have never been higher . . .


Chloe Gong: Our Violent Ends (Sequel to These Violent Delights) (179 & above)


Cath Howe: My Life on Fire (BBA Longlist 2024)


Becky Jerams & Ellie Wyatt: The Songs you've never heard (Shortlist YA Prize 2023)


Lena Jones: Agatha Oddley - The Silver Serpent (Book 3)


Challenge: Join the Thieves' Gambit, a cut-throat competition to crown the world's greatest thief


M.G. Leonard & Sam Sedgman: The Highland Falcon Thief


M.G. Leonard: Twitch (Book 1 The Twitchers)


Ayaan Mohamud: You think you know me (Lit in colour Reading list)


Lauren Munoz: Suddenly a Murder


Caroline O'Donoghue: Every Gift a Curse (Book 3 All our Hidden Gifts)


Tom Palmer: D-Day


J.P.Rose: The Haunting of Tyrese Walker (BBA Longlist 2024)


Laura Steven: Every exquisite thing (Y9 & above)

Teri Terry: Black Night Falling (Book 3 The Circle trilogy)



Dustin Than: You've reached Sam



Eloise Williams: Honesty & Lies






David Yoon: Super Fake Love Song <mark>(Lit in Colour Reading list)</mark>




Malorie Blackman: Just Sayin'

Malorie Blackman is one of Britain's best and most beloved children's authors, the landmark Noughts & Crosses series included amongst her many books. Her journey to becoming a writer was a long one, but throughout it all she retained a sense of wonder and humour. Before her BAFTA award wins, her OBE and appointment as Children's Laureate in 2013, Malorie was a young girl from South London who fell in love with books and found a home in her local library and a world of words at her fingertips. From embracing her alternative way of seeing the world and all its fascinating differences and possibilities; to her desire to share that passion with others by becoming an English teacher but being told no by her careers advisor because of her race; to the doctor who told her she would be dead by thirty when she was diagnosed with sickle cell, and the eighty plus rejection letters she received from publishers before her first ever children's book was published. Her life's journey - has been an eventful one – marked by trauma, trials, and triumph, yet in spite of all the many setbacks in her life, she held fastidiously on to her dream of becoming a writer.




Elizabeth Hellmuth Margulis: The Psychology of Music


Raj Kaur Khaira: Stories for South Asian Super Girls
